SCALE OF THE PROBLEM

- Approximately **2,000 rapes & 10,000 sexual assaults per week** (*British Crime Survey, 2010*)
- **89% of these crimes are never reported** (*Home Office & Dept of Health, 2012*)
- **A child reports sexual abuse or rape every 20 minutes** (*NSPCC 2012*)
- **26,314 children aged 0-16 in Coventry & Warwickshire are likely to have been raped or abused** (*Taskforce Alberti – Mar 2010*)
- **UK has one of the lowest conviction rates in Europe at 6.5% of reported incidents** (*Fawcett, 2007*)
- **160 crimes of child exploitation has been reported across Warwickshire & West Mercia** (*Crime Intelligence – Police 2014*)

EXPLOITATION

Sexual exploitation can take many forms from the seemingly ‘consensual’ relationship where sex is exchanged for attention/affection, accommodation or gifts, to serious organised crime and child trafficking.

What marks out exploitation is that the perpetrator has some form of power over the victim by virtue of their age, gender, intellect or with violence.



Organised Crime Through Gangs

- Following Operation Span in the North West, nine defendants were brought to justice in May 2012 when they were found guilty of serious serial sexual abuse, including multiple rapes.
- These men targeted vulnerable young women, pretending to show them affection and by giving them food, money, alcohol and attention, they groomed and controlled them and demanded repayment through sex. Any resistance was met with threats and violence.

Youth Rape

In separate cases, two teenage boys were prosecuted for rape in the North West. One boy committed rape as well as sexual assaults on two girls.

The second pleaded guilty to raping a four-year-old girl.



Cyber Crime

A defendant, who had worked in Legal Services in a local authority, was convicted of offences related to child abuse images – including more than 5,700 indecent images.

Signs of Sexual Exploitation

The following list of indicators is not exhaustive but highlights common signs in identifying victims of sexual exploitation.

- receiving unexplained gifts or gifts from unknown sources
- having unaffordable new things (clothes, mobile) or expensive habits
- changes in the way they dress
- getting in/out of different cars driven by unknown adults
- having older boyfriends or girlfriends
- hanging out with groups of older people, unexplained changes in behaviour or personality (chaotic, aggressive, sexual)
- self-harming, suicidal thoughts/attempts, eating disorders
- drug or alcohol misuse
