Levels

- When work is marked students will be given targets for improvement
- For assessed work they will be given levels that align with the new number grades at GCSE where 9 is the highest and 1 the lowest



Baseline RHS level and Targets

- Each student will have a baseline level for each subject
- This will be determined by their baseline assessment
- Baseline levels used (together with other FFT data) to determine end of year (and key stage 3/4) targets
- A target is the end of key stage or course grade/level that your daughter should be attempting to reach or exceed.
- By the end of Year 11, on average, students will be aiming for grades 7,8 and 9 in their GCSE's

Progress checks

- Informal check every half term
- Formal progress checks every term for parents, students and Senior Leadership Team
- They will report on progress and attitude to learning in each subject
- Enables progress to be tracked and intervention plans put in place if a student is significantly behind target.
- Autumn progress check due: Monday 19th October

Intervention

- Can be:
- subject specific support from the department concerned
- small group tuition or one to one support
- a talk with the Pastoral Manager or Mrs Grogan
- mentoring by an older student or member of staff
- referral to the main school Learning Mentor (Mr Phillips)

Keeping Rugby High School Students safe online

Rugby High School is committed to the use of technology in order to enhance the quality of teaching and learning.

As a school we believe that the safety of our students is paramount.

Here are the guidelines below for students staying safe online.



Rules

- Students legally are not allowed to join social media sites such as Facebook, Twitter and instagram until they are 13 years of age. If students join before this age they can face having their accounts deleted by the social network and a lifetime ban from the site.
- If a student is 13 years of age and does want a social media account then it is best if they set this account up with their parent/carer. It is highly recommended that the parent has copy of the login details such as the username and password, so they can monitor the safety of their daughter.
- It is also recommended that one of the conditions when creating the account is that the student must have their parent has a friend.
- Students must not contact strangers over the internet or accept any friend requests from people they do not know.
- Students are reminded that everything they post online is recoverable regardless of whether or not they have deleted it. The school and the police can recover written posts and photographs if necessary.

• Students should not post insulting or negative comments and/or photographs on any internet site.

Rules

- It is strongly recommended that students do not have a snapchat account and instead if they wish to share photographs an instagram account is recommended as an alternative.
- Students should not be using their devices such as phones, laptops or/and desktops half an hour before they go to bed. Sleep has been proven to be vital to a child's development. It is highly recommended that the student gives their device to their parent to charge over night and not to keep it in their bedroom where it can disrupt their sleep. If your daughter uses their device as an alarm clock then it is recommended that they buy a separate alarm clock to use in their room.
- A reason that some students would desire a social networking account is a belief that every other student possesses one. This is in-fact not true there are many students who do not have a social media account and are very happy not having an account.
- It is important to note that if use correctly social media sites can be a safe and effective medium of communication.

Why is Rugby High School planning to ask students to bring their own devices?

ICT has the power to transform students' learning experiences.

Being a confident, capable and discerning user of ICT is taken for granted in higher education and by many employers.

There are occasions when staff would like to use ICT to enhance their students' learning experience but when they can't because all of the current facilities are booked.

The school does not have the resources to purchase and replace at regular intervals a personal device for all students.



Government guidelines

- Reminder of Government Guidelines
- Teacher must maintain a 2m distance from students
- Teaching from the front of the class only, teacher not to move around the class
- Colleagues to maintain a 2m distance
- Any equipment used by students to be quarantined for 3 days
- Students to remain in bubble areas, facing forward in rows for lessons
- Outside of lessons students have been told not to sit in each other's seats and to stay away from the teacher's chair and desk. If they are not abiding by this, they are breaking the rules.
