Extension Activities that parents can undertake to support learning.

- Discuss the lives of the Tudor monarchs after 1509 (Henry VIII, Edward VI, Mary, Elizabeth I). Examples: Why did Henry close the monasteries, in your view? Which of the Tudors was the best monarch, and which was the worst, and why?
- Ask students to recap what they learned about life in Medieval times.
