Recap the Present Tense of regular -er, -ir & -re verbs and brainstorm a list of infinitives for each type

Speaking "Juste une minute"
To develop your fluency, can you speak for one minute on the topic of **Mes passe-temps**

Practise the -IEN sound: très bien, un chien, rien, tiens! musicien, australien. Note how the addition of -ne in the feminine changes the sound - musicienne etc

Brainstorm adjectives (M & F) describing someone's personality

Make your pronunciation of -tion (see-ong) sound really French. On Collins, listen to and imitate: *l'équitation, la natation, les informations, attention, un film d'action, national*

Using a verb + infinitive (il apprend à conduire j'ai oublié d'appeler) adds sophistication to your work. Look up the construction & write 10 sentences. (Oxford AQAp.185)

Complete a translation task from your GCSE text book / revision booklet. Take care over tenses.

Les opposés

Most adjectives just add an -e to form the Feminine. What other patterns are there?

le revers de la médaille

How many intensifiers can you think of? (very, completely...) Do some research and add to your list
