# The Basics

1 Application Submitted via UCAS

Up to 5 choices

4 for Medicine, Dentistry and Vet Science + 1 different choice

Teachers provide references



Personal Details Name, address, etc.

- •Residency Status
- Personal Circumstances
- •Up to five choices
  - •Universities won't know who else you applied to
  - •Don't need to be ranked

Course Choices

•Grades you already have

•Other exams: Music qualification, Sports Leadership

Education History

> Employment History

•Any part time work you have

Personal Statemen •Chance for you to show us why you are the right person to study that course



# The Application Process

- Use a sensible and non-school related email
- Make sure you include the correct qualification type and grade
- Start early and don't miss internal and external deadlines
- You can apply to the same university multiple times for different courses
- There is a slightly different form to apply to conservatoires
- **£27.50 application fee** upon submission


# What can I do in the city centre?

- Either try something new or continue with a previous hobby





# Year Abroad or Year in Industry


## **Year in Industry:**

- Occurs after end of 2<sup>nd</sup> year
- Gain work experience of a real-life working environment. Learn more about professions and possible graduate job
- Normally paid position
- We don't place you in the placements ourselves but instead provide guidance and support
- Support on placement- Academic contact, visits, personal reflective journals

### Year Abroad:

- Occurs after end of 2<sup>nd</sup> year
- Opportunity to travel and learn simultaneously
- Links within Europe: Belgium, Italy, Netherland, Spain
- Links outside of EU: Australia, Canada, Tokyo, USA

- 66% of graduate jobs do **not** require a specific degree
