What information would you need to know to answer this? Can you find that information? If so, what does it show you? Do you have a personal view? You could choose to plan this essay or, even better, write it!
Five fun learning challenges to undertake before September:	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1) Search YouTube for the video called 'What Is Sociology?: Crash Course Sociology #1'. Watch this video and note down five things that tell you what Sociology is.2) Think about what makes up 'society' by answering these questions:<ol style="list-style-type: none">a) List three ways in which British society has changed over the last 100 years.b) List three ways in which British society is different to another (e.g. America, India)3) We will consider what makes up our identity. We often feel our identity is impacted by our social group, e.g. class, gender. List four social groups you belong to and explain how being part of that group affects your identity.4) A key concept in Sociology is socialisation. This is the process where we are taught our society's 'norms and values' – that is, acceptable behaviours and things that we all agree are important or 'right'. Can you think of three places (what we would call structures or institutions, e.g. education) from which we receive socialisation?5) Research this question 'What is the difference between society and culture?'
