

Aim:

To prevent grooming, harassment and assault crimes:

- Educate people on harassment and assault.
- Provide information on self-defence and what to do in different situations.

Delivery details:

What:

- Workshop sessions, delivered in schools to educate students of years 7-9 = 360 people, (120 each year group).
- Self-defence sessions (short video / film).
- Educate all genders about what to do in a range of situations.
- Educate people not to offend in the first place.
- Start with Rugby High School.
- Personal attack alarms -> (all gender).

How:

- Workshops could be delivered in a number of ways: PowerPoint Presentation / little workshops / video / self-defence video / a short movie. Total time 1hr30mins.
 - ⇒ Encourage empowerment and speaking up.
 - ⇒ Teacher Feedback.
- Quizzes developed – as a way of educating people and sharing information.
 - ⇒ Feedback from quiz (scenarios, what they would do, what they already know).
- A QR code developed for people to scan on their phones that could link to quizzes and further information.

Who:

4-6 volunteer helpers from the project team Samuda.

Volunteers (local martial arts or self-defence groups, possibly G Force, (form a connection with G Force).

Costs

Funding would be required for advertising, freebies to take home, rape alarms.

Anticipated Challenges and Risk Analysis:

Challenge / Risk	Impact / Likelihood	Mitigating action
Rape alarms cost too much and are not within budget	7/10	Seek sponsorship
Lack of Volunteers	4/10	Enable presentations to be self-ran
Content viewed negatively for using self-defence sessions	8/10	?
